# **60 USAID Officials Removed From Duty**

According to media reports, President Trump has removed the entire leadership structure of the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), previously run by Samantha Power.



This is not necessarily a domestic issue. Those who walk the deepest political weeds well understand that USAID is the cover agency for the interventionist efforts of the CIA. USAID is the agency silo that coordinates the meddling in foreign elections, organizes the revolutions and political opposition of those deemed out of alignment with global democratic norms, funds the NGOs who do the ground operations, and generally seeks to replace foreign leaders.

President Trump has just removed the entire leadership structure of the USAID enterprise, approximately 60 government officials. You can bet that nationalist leaders of foreign countries are smiling now while Brussels (EU Commission) is left wondering who will pay for the foot soldiers.

(<u>Via Politico</u>) – [...] The order — sent via email to members of the senior executive and senior Foreign Service — was issued close to the end of the business day Monday and was effective immediately, according to two current USAID officials and three former USAID officials told of the communication. It comes as USAID and the State Department have been ordered to impose halts on a vast number of humanitarian and related programs around the world.

The decision appears to affect nearly every career staffer who holds a top leadership role at the agency, at least in Washington — around 60 officials, the current and former officials said.

The cuts have left many offices within the agency entirely devoid of senior non-political leadership. The entire cadre of leaders who run USAID's bureau for global health, for example, was put on leave,

according to two of the officials.

"This is a huge morale hit," said a former senior Trump administration official who was also told of the move. "This is the leadership of the agency. This is like taking out all the generals. I don't know what they hope to accomplish by it." (read more)

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

There is zero provision in the U.S. Constitution that provides for ANY part of the Federal government to be independent from any of the three branches, nor can any part of the fed. govt. report administratively to more than one of the three branches.

ALL agencies and departments of the Federal govt. that are not aligned to the Legislative Branch (Congress), or the Judicial Branch (U.S. courts – District, Appellate, Bankruptcy & Supreme) fall under the authority of the Executive Branch, the head of which is POTUS.

The entire object pf the Constitution was to make every part of the federal government responsible to the U.S. citizens (voters), either directly (Congress members and President), or indirectly (Executive Branch – headed by POTUS (impeachable by Congress) and Judiciary (appointed by POTUS but approved by and impeachable by Congress).

SCOTUS' July 2024 ruling (Loper Bright Enterprises v. Raimondo, Relentless v. Department of Commerce) overturned the 1984 Chevron ruling and confirmed the Executive's ultimate authority over ALL government agencies.

Established through separate statutes passed by Congress, each respective statutory grant of authority defines the goals the agency must work towards, as well as what substantive areas, if any, over which it may have the power of rulemaking. These agency rules (or regulations), when in force, have the power of federal law.[2]

These agencies are not represented in the cabinet and are not part of the Executive Office of the president:[18]

The Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) gathers foreign intelligence and provides national security assessments to policymakers in the United States. It acts as the primary human intelligence provider for the federal government. It is one of the principal members of the Intelligence Community, which is overseen by the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI), which is itself an independent agency.

"The National Security Act of 1947 established CIA as an independent, civilian intelligence agency within the executive branch. The Act charged CIA with coordinating the Nation's intelligence activities and, among other duties, collecting, evaluating, and disseminating intelligence affecting national security.

The Act also created a Director of Central Intelligence, or DCI, to lead both CIA and the U.S. Intelligence Community. The DCI also served as the president's main adviser on all intelligence matters."

The CIA is an INDEPENDENT agency of the executive branch. That means that it works directly for the President. It does NOT fall under DOD, or DOJ, or State. In an org chart the D/CIA's line goes directly to the President, the same as the SecDef, SecState, Attorney General, etc.

Congress has oversight of ALL Executive Branch agencies via control of funding, including the CIA. Congressional oversight of the CIA is via the House Intel Committee (HIPSCI) and the Senate Intel Committee (SISCI).


